6 days. The Tren Crucero Railroad Line has 4 luxury carriages holding 54 passengers, and employs restored, century-old steam locomotives. The 453-kilometer route is made up of narrow-gauge line built at the turn of the 20th century, crossing the Avenue of the Volcanoes from Quito to Guayaquil.

TERMS & CONDITIONS

- 1. How to make your Reservation > After selecting your tour and departure date, simply complete and submit the tour planning remittance payment via this invoice, as well as any provided pay link for total flight costs. SouthAmerica.travel accepts bank transfer, ACH payment, check, Visa, Mastercard, American Express, Diner's Club, JCB, Discover, PayPal and Bitcoin. The initial Tour Planning Remittance is generally 20% of the land package price. Minimum US \$250 per person. A higher remittance amount may be required for certain customized itineraries, lodges and cruises, special events such as Carnival, or for securing special flight arrangements. Some flight tickets and special non-refundable land arrangements (such as Carnival and New Year's accommodation) may not be paid by credit card. See also note in International Flights section below. Please make your reservations as early as possible since many flights are completely filled 3 to 6 months before departure.
- 2. Final Payment > Final payment is due 45 days in advance of the tour. These payments are due in our office or submitted online 45 days prior to the departure date. If reservations are made less than 45 days prior to departure, payment in full is required at the time of booking. If final payments are not received on time, SouthAmerica.travel may cancel the reservation and invoke the cancellation fee
- 3. Cancellations, Changes & Refunds > If cancellation is received in writing by SouthAmerica.travel more than 45 days prior to departure, your payment will be refunded, less 20% (minimum US \$250) per person of the full package price, as well as any non-refundable items If you must withdraw or make a change 45 days or less prior to departure, the following fees will apply:

45 Days to 31 Days: prior to departure 35% of total 30 Days to 15 Days: prior to departure 50% of total 14 Days to Day of Departure: 90% of total (100% thereafter)

Additionally, US \$175 or more may be assessed for changes in air travel bookings after tickets have been issued, if change is allowed by carrier, in accordance with the airline's and issuer's change and cancellation policies, and depending on the booking class of the ticket. Fee assessments and changes are the responsibility of the ticketing agent and airlines. Certain items (including but not limited to Cruises, Lodges, Tickets, Carnival & New Year's hotel deposits) are non-refundable and therefore excluded from the refund policy. See note on Travel Insurance below.

- 4. Invoices in Your Currency > The currency of tourism in South America has historically been the US Dollar. SouthAmerica.travel's financial system is therefore set to invoice in USD, however we are happy to send you an invoice in your local currency. The exchange rate we use is based on the daily exchange rate at XE.com, to which our credit card processor adds a 2% conversion rate to all currencies except USD, GBP and EUR (a rate lower than most banks and credit card companies charge.) Paying in your local currency avoids the additional 2 3% "cross-border fee" charged on most credit card transactions, and is therefore beneficial to most clients. Please note that SouthAmerica.travel will re-calculate with the daily exchange rate at the time of your final payment, which, as exchange rates fluctuate, may be higher or lower than the rate of your initial tour planning remittance.
- 5. Surface Travel & Sightseeing and Land-Only Tours > Ground arrangements generally include intercity travel by air-conditioned car, van or motor coach, train, plane, boat and ship as per the itinerary. If you wish to make independent flight arrangements, you may still reserve the land portion of a tour.
- 6. Flights > Your air transport is a contract made with the airline through the ticketing agent, which is independent of SouthAmerica.travel. Listed prices for flights are estimates only, based on best space availability, and are not guaranteed. SouthAmerica.travel works with various agents to secure the lowest fares available. Tickets may be issued by a 3rd party consolidator directly. The airlines hold a limited number of seats at listed prices; other fares are negotiated at the time of booking to get the best possible fare. For early bookings, we may be able to negotiate a lower price. In most cases, the airlines require immediate payment at the time of booking to hold seats on airpasses. SouthAmerica.travel or its agents will inform you about this when the situation arises. Often least cost bookings require immediate payment, in full, and are non-refundable. Requests for specific airlines and/or seats are accepted as preferences only and cannot be guaranteed. All airline seat assignments and frequent flyer programs are under the control of the respective airlines. Domestic overnights due to flight scheduling are the responsibility of the Traveler. We suggest you contact the airlines directly regarding seat assignments and special meals.
- 7. Taxes & Fees > If not collected in advance by the airline, airport taxes must be paid by the Traveler at check-in. Please call the airline in advance if unclear whether airport taxes are included in your fare. Entrance Fees to National Parks and other destinations are set by the respective government, and often change without advance notice. The Traveler is responsible for any changes in fees made after initial booking.
- 8. Visas and Immunizations > Visas and/or reciprocity fees may be required in advance for North Americans and Australians traveling to Brazil, Argentina, Paraguay and Bolivia (U.S. only), and other nationals. Information regarding visa requirements for all countries can be found at SouthAmerica.travel/visas or at www.VisaHQ.com

 $Information\ regarding\ immunizations\ can\ be\ found\ on\ the\ website\ of\ the\ Center\ for\ Disease\ Control\ (www.cdc.gov).\ You\ are\ strongly\ encouraged\ to\ consult\ a\ physician.$

- 9. Meals > Many foods in South America will be familiar to North Americans and Europeans, and include many additional and amazing flavors! Please inform your tour director or guide of special dietary requirements at your first meeting; s/he will do his/her best to arrange for other meals.
- 10. Hotels > Hotels reserved for our tours are rated as First Class or above, and are indicated by a star rating in the itinerary. The few exceptions (generally, small hotels and pousadas (B&B's)) have been chosen for location and/or atmosphere. These hotels are clean, comfortable and located to best

facilitate guided sightseeing of the area. If, for any reason, it becomes necessary to utilize other hotels, they will be of a similar or higher standard. Where not, compensation will be provided. Triple room accommodations are available on a limited basis, sometimes at a reduced per person price. Triple rooms usually consist of a twin-bedded room with an additional folding bed or cot for the third person. They may not be comfortable for three adults.

- 11. Small Groups > In cases of groups of less than 10 passengers, intercity transport may be on regularly scheduled first class intercity coaches or planes. In such cases, a guide/driver will escort you from your hotel/sightseeing to the coach station or airport and assist with check-in. Another qualified guide will await your arrival at your destination, and will assist with transfer to your hotel. Dates for tours are guaranteed; however, should a group consist of only 1 passenger, Single Traveler fees may apply.
- 12. Tour Price Does Not Include > Beverages, meals not detailed in the itinerary, as well as desserts at barbeque (all-you-can-eat) "Rodizios"; personal expenses including passport & visa fees, optional sightseeing tours, traditional end of the tour gratuity to your Tour Director or City/Sightseeing Guide (generally US \$3-5 p.p./per day) and Driver (generally US \$2-3 p.p./per day), tips to local city guides, Travel Insurance & other items of a personal nature.
- 13. Travel Insurance > To protect yourself against unforeseen circumstances, it is a condition of booking one of SouthAmerica.travel's tours that travelers have an inclusive travel insurance for the full duration of their travel arrangements including illness, injury, death, loss of bagage and personal items, cancellation and curtailment. Such insurance policies may be available from your Travel Consultant, insurance broker and other sources. In addition some providers offer an inclusive travel insurance that also covers "cancel for any reason" (see SouthAmerica.travel/insurance for a variety of options).
